This month of June brings two related celebrations for the church:

- 1. Pride Month, celebrating the diversity of sexual and gender orientations with which humans are created.
  - -The Walla Walla Pride March will once again begin and end at our church, Saturday June 22, at 10:30am.
  - -This is a good opportunity to acknowledge that our church is approaching next year the 20th anniversary of becoming Open & Affirming.
  - -We're planning a series of classes to discuss faithful approaches to Christian commitment and the Bible that are affirming of diverse sexual and gender orientations. Stay tuned for announcement of dates.
- 2. A new cohort of middle school youth has graduated from our "Our Whole Lives" sexuality and faith education program. We are extremely proud of these brave and good-hearted young people. And we are very grateful to our facilitators Margaret and Matthew Thomas, Cindi Abbott, and Rachel Elfenbein.
- -Here are the guiding values of the United Church of Christ's Our Whole Lives program:
  - -Every person is entitled to dignity and self-worth
  - -We respect other people because they are equal to us, as beloved children of the living God,
  - -We need to avoid double standards. Women and men of all ages, people of different races, backgrounds, income levels, physical and mental abilities, and sexual orientations must have equal value and rights.
  - -Sexual relationships should never be coercive or exploitative.
  - -Sexuality in our society is damaged by violence, exploitation, alienation, dishonesty, abuse of power, and the treatment of persons as objects.
  - -We are called to enrich our lives by expressing sexuality in ways that enhance human whole ness and fulfillment and express love, commitment, delight and pleasure.
  - -All persons have the right and obligation to make responsible sexual choices, in ways that are appropriate to them, and to their age and stage of development.

This past Sunday I had the delightful opportunity to hold Sunday school with our intermediate (3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, & 5<sup>th</sup> grade) kids. We were discussing *Matthew 3: 16-17*, the story of the River Jordan, Jesus, John the Baptist, the dove, and God saying "this is my Son, with whom I am well pleased." Our kids provided insightful commentary on how it feels when someone is truly proud of us. We then brainstormed ways that we might support those around us – friends, classmates, teammates, neighbors- who perhaps don't hear "I'm proud of you" on a regular basis. The green shoots of our church are a precious treasure, and I can't wait to see how

their values, spirit and bountiful gifts will mix with the pathways before them.

I'm also very proud of our church. You all are part of the wonderful growth and opportunity that is unfolding before us. Young teens who are learning in-depth about healthy sexuality from caring and committed instructors of our OWL (*Our Whole Lives*) program; a youth ministry that is receiving a timely infusion of resources and energy from a special Christian Education committee so we can better support the spiritual development of FCC's next generations; the exploration of improved signage to better welcome people into the physical space of our church community; on-going ministries of Wednesday Soup Lunch, the Christian Aid Center, and Helpline; the widely supported initiative that will raise solar panels to our church roof by summer's end; spiritual support of our covenant groups; and the on-going partnerships that our faith community maintains with the recovery, LGBTQ, immigrant, arts, and environmental interests that add life and vitality to our valley.

In the coming weeks our church leadership will begin preparations for next year's budget, which will encompass the priorities of our faith community in the coming year and beyond. Please add your voice to this important process by working with our trustees, deacons, officers and committees. While our future is bright, it is highly dependent upon each of us working and sharing together. It is exciting to imagine how the decisions we make in the coming months might ripple out well into the future of our church, and our world.








## **COVENANT GROUPS**





We met at 3:45 on Sunday, May 19, prepared to cook dinner for the guests at the Christian Aid Center. We had a crew of all ages: Jenn, Oliver and Kirby Rickard, Jill and Eliza Juers, and Lee Coleman. Doug Juers arrived later with Henry to help cook and serve. Jenn engineered a casserole that was a huge hit. It included rice, ground pork, peppers and olives, cheese sauce, tomatoes, and hot sauce. Jill and Eliza prepared steamed broccoli, cooked carrots and cucumbers. Oliver and Kirby polished apples and selected and sliced a host of cakes and pies. We served well over 60 guests, and scraped the bottom of every serving dish. We also served about 25 folks from the women's shelter across the street. One gentleman wanted to express his thanks for hosting the 12 Step programs that he has been attending for decades. He said "your church saved my life".
