Strengthening the church's culture of caring for one another – cultivating an open culture for sharing and caring for one another's needs and hurts, and ensuring that there aren't folks who are overlooked.

Amplifying expressions of gratitude for all the ways that so many folks give to and through the church.

Having more education in the Bible and adult religious formation.

Growing more partnerships outside the church, as well as with all the groups who use the church.

There's so much more to say! This is not at all exhaustive. I've sent out full notes via "Midweek Moment" emails and am happy to share them to anyone who wants. We'll soon have a more digestible summary. And, as I started by saying, your lay leaders are helping us all keep focus.

May we draw from our shared strengths to keep growing, fed by the light of God's grace.

SKI FOR LIGHT

During the week of January 26 to February 3, three of the First Congregational family will be at 8000 feet in the Colorado Rockies guiding blind cross country skiers. Fifteen years ago Lee Coleman began guiding for SFL each winter. Three years ago Bernie Newman signed on, and this year Larry Frank will be a guide.

About 125 blind skiers will attend, and each will be matched with a sighted guide. We ski all day on the trails at Snow Mountain Ranch, the YMCA of the Rockies. Each guide provides the eyes for the pair, and each skier, the inspiration. We have meals together, interest sessions, evening programs, and even a biathlon course. At least 50 guide dogs attend, but they aren't allowed on the ski trails, so dog walkers care for them during the days. The trails are set with double tracks. There are courses for beginners and some for advanced skiers. Ski for Light is 100% volunteer ... everyone pays his way, shares in the work and in the camaraderie. When Larry, Bernie and Lee return, they will have represented FCC well and will certainly have tales to tell! ~Lee Coleman




