

## First Congregational Church Highlights Newsletter March 2019

A core value of our congregational way is to honor how every believer has been given by God special gifts for their own expression of Christian ministry. Those gifts and ministries are richly varied, as are the journeys different people take to recognizing their particular God-given purpose. This leads us to have an uplifting approach to lay ministry and a humbling approach to formal ordained ministry in the church. This also leads us to really value the role of a community of faith in helping our fellow members discern and grow into the gifts God has given them for their particular form of ministry.

One of your fellow church members, Terry Rice, has long felt a call to ministry as a hospice chaplain – a call that may well be best expressed as ordained by the church. But his prior faith community would not brook this call due to prejudice against Terry's sexual orientation. He has since found an affirming spiritual home with our church.

Last March our church council voted to support Terry's discernment of this call by forming a "Local Church Discernment Committee." The committee was comprised of Jill Juers, Joyce Schwenke, Cheryl Pira, Holly Farnam, Jonathan Webster, J.R. Van Slyke and myself. When this committee met it became clear that these members were each living into their own ministerial gifts to support and challenge the spiritual gifts of another. It was also clear that there was deep wisdom in the Manual on Ministry of our United Church of Christ, which served as our guide, along with the Holy Spirit.


After our meetings with Terry and our prayerful reflection on them, we took a vote. We were impressed with Terry's spiritual and personal gifts and experience, which he brings to bear in his vocation as a hospice chaplain. We witness in him a strong sense of faith and of mission, as well as wisdom, sincerity, skill, humility, and gentleness that he brings to bear to his work as a chaplain. He especially has gifts for ministering to souls who are in crisis and on the margins. For reasons such as these, we voted unanimously to recommend Terry Rice to the Pacific Northwest Conference Eastside Committee on Ministry, which oversees ordination.

After our Church Council's approval, the Conference Committee on Ministry met with Terry. I am pleased to report that they have formally accepted Terry "In Care" as a "Member in Discernment." Welcome to UCC jargon! This means that they recognize in Terry a strong potential call to ordained ministry in hospice chaplaincy, and will now guide and challenge him in developing and discerning his ministerial gifts. In short, he now has a lot of homework. Please lift up in prayer Terry and his journey ahead.

This is yet another great opportunity for us all to grow into the gifts God has given this community of faith and the United Church of Christ.




